The purpose of CUGG is to raise computer skill levels in our community.

Some of our group are skilled professionals who enjoy talking about computers and helping others. Some are beginners who are initially confused by much of what we say and do, but want to learn more. Others are intermediate, know-enough-to-be-dangerous users who find they learn something useful at every meeting.

Name Badges

To facilitate our informal conversations with each other, each person rates himself/herself “Beginner”, “Intermediate”, or “Advanced”. Your name badge will have a star in a color reflecting your rating. This tells everyone how technical you want people to get when talking to you. According to your self-rating, your badge will have either a:

- Gold star (Advanced),
- Red star (Intermediate), or
- Green star (Beginner).

Website

CUGG’s website is www.cugg.org. (CUGG is a member of the Association of Personal Computer User Groups, “APCUG”, so you see their logo on our website.) The home page has the dates and times of the next meeting of the board of directors and the next general meeting. The agendas of past and upcoming general meeting are also available under the “Meetings” link.

“Random Access” is our monthly newsletter, published by CUGGer Don Wiegel. It is part of the website, accessed by clicking on “Random Access” in the menu at the left on the CUGG home page.

Only the “Sustaining Members” section is password protected. It takes you to a list of their email addresses. We password-protect it to keep bad guys from copying the addresses. (The addresses are encoded in such a way as to not look like an email address, so that robots roaming the Internet for email addresses won’t pick ours up.) Getting Help

There are several ways to get help from others with your computer questions and problems:

- Email your question to the full CUGG list. Address your email to members@cugg.org. It will go to everyone on the list. You have to be on the list or you can not send to it. You get on the list by being a Sustaining Member or a registered guest. (*Tip*: When you “Reply” to a message you receive from this list, your reply goes to everyone on the list. To reply to just one person, send him or her a new message.)
- Email your question to a particular person you think might help. CUGGers email addresses are listed under the Sustaining Members section.
- Post your question on the CUGG Web Board. Access the Web Board by clicking on Web Board at the left of the CUGG home page. You can register and get a password so the Web Board recognizes you, or you can just post questions and answers as “Guest”.
- Ask your question during the Q & A session of a monthly meeting. (Others benefit from hearing your question and the answer, too.)
- Some CUGG attendees are IT professionals who will make house calls for a fee. They don’t promote themselves through CUGG, but most any red or gold star badges could name them for you.

Sustaining Members

Sustaining Members contribute \$30 per year, collected in January and good through December. They make our meetings possible. Later in the year, contributions to become a Sustaining Member are \$2.50 per month times the number of months left through December. You are welcome to attend our meetings whether you contribute or not.
